Chicago Armitage Urban Study Experience

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Introduction & Overview

The objective of Chicago Armitage Urban Study Experience is to prepare men and women to do effective urban ministry in the cities of the U.S. and the world. This is accomplished with a *Head, Heart, and Hands* approach:

Head - Gaining the knowledge and understanding necessary for an effective biblical urban ministry.
Heart - Growing in compassion and zeal for the urban masses by engaging in one on one ministry.
Hands - Developing the skills needed to effectively accomplish productive ministry. This is accomplished through service in a thriving urban church alongside seasoned staff members and volunteers.

Chicago Armitage Urban Study Experience was established to increase awareness of urban needs and create a learning space. Armitage Baptist Church provides exposure, experience, and a training center. It is a place where people can see a thriving urban local church firsthand and study, learn, and experience effective urban ministry.

CAUSE provides four programs to choose from:

1. Weeklong Trip – Explore the Possibilities

Spend a week over a school break or during the summer in Chicago and see what an internship at Armitage is all about. We will provide you with housing as long as your request is made at least 30 days in advance. All you need is transportation and miscellaneous expenses. You can also visit Armitage with an established partner church as part of a working Missions team.

2. Summer/Short-Term Internship

A short and rewarding summer experience designed for the person who is looking for solid exposure to the urban ministry paradigm. The 2-3 month term will provide an opportunity to experience city life and local church-based urban ministry. The intern may choose one of several tracks, which include options like Children's Ministry, Youth Ministry, Pastoral Ministry, Christian Education, Administration, Social Ministry, etc.

3. One year internship

A twelve-month internship is designed to prepare men and women to minister in the cities of America and around the world. Intern requirements include monthly objectives that involve assignments completed from our library of urban ministry materials, site visits to local urban ministries and involvement in local church ministry. As with the Summer Internship program, the one-year intern has a choice of one of several tracks or specialties in which to focus his/her concentration. With these tracks you will receive firsthand exposure and experience training with seasoned staff and volunteers at your side. Along with the track emphases we have One Year Intern Training Objectives to help you get the most out of your experience.

4. Residency

Our Residency program is designed for people who already have urban ministry experience, have finished at least a Bachelor's degree, and want to be further developed in the laboratory of actual weekly church ministry *leadership*. The program has 1 or 2 year options, with a 3rd year possible. Residents are remunerated on a part-time or full-time basis if funding permits, participate fully in the life of the church and church staff, and are given a substantial ministry load. Residents are closely mentored by the pastor over their area of ministry leadership and given training and feedback to develop into fully trained leaders.

What are the basic requirements to be an intern?

- 1. Live out committed discipleship to Jesus
- 2. Live in the city of Chicago for the period of the internship. In some cases, CAUSE staff can assist the intern in securing housing.
- 3. Be an active part of Armitage body life.
- 4. Provide the income needed to pay for your housing, food and other needs while in Chicago.
- 5. Fill out and submit the Application for Internship.

What are the basic requirements to be a resident?

- 1. Live out committed discipleship to Jesus
- 2. Possess at least a Bachelor's degree.
- 3. Live in the city of Chicago for the period of the residency.
- 4. Join Armitage as an official member and be an active part of body life.
- 5. Fill out and submit the Application for Residency.

In addition, all CAUSE participants will:

- Meet regularly with their mentor and/or supervisor
- Attend all regular staff meetings
- Participate in staff shadowing as available
- Keep a spiritual journal
- Regularly engage in prayer walks
- Participate in hospital visitation as needed
- Participate as a prayer partner in Celebration services

If there is a credit requirement for college/seminary, CAUSE staff will assist in the correspondence process and make sure internship requirements are met.

CAUSE Program Basic Detail Summary - at a Glance

1. Weeklong Trip

Option 1: Explore

- Spend a week in Chicago over a school break or during the summer to simply observe and learn
- We will provide you with housing as long as your request is made at least 30 days in advance. All you need is transportation and miscellaneous expenses
- No formal application is needed you can just interact with the CAUSE Director to work out the details.

Option 2: Serve

- Bring a team of high school students, young adults or adults to serve and learn in the city as part of a long-term reciprocal partnership
- We can provide you with housing. Housing is free for teams working directly with ABC
- Instruction and debriefing about the urban ministry paradigm will be given
- Apply by contacting the CAUSE Director and completing the application

2. Summer/Short-Term Internship

- Several tracks are available, including Children's, Youth, Worship and Pastoral Ministries
- Working directly with the church staff & volunteers in the ministry track of your choice
- 6-day workweek, including shadowing ABC staff and attending staff meetings
- Intentional development of spiritual disciplines
- Immersion in ABC body life
- Weekly meeting with a mentor in your field of study and/or the CAUSE director
- Urban Ministry and urban culture site visits and urban leader interviews
- Reading and media assignments from our library of urban ministry materials

3. One year internship

- Same tracks as the Summer Internship
- Working directly with the church staff & volunteers in the ministry track of your choice
- Flexible workweek that includes shadowing ABC staff and attending staff meetings
- Intentional development of spiritual disciplines
- Immersion in ABC body life
- Weekly meeting with a mentor in your field of study and/or the CAUSE director
- Urban Ministry and urban culture site visits and urban leader interviews
- Reading and media assignments from our library of urban ministry materials
- Exposure to a broader swath of church life
- More opportunities for evangelism, outreach and shepherding
- Various ministry projects specifically related to your track

4. Residency

- Same tracks as the Internships
- 1, 2, or 3 year options
- Remunerated either on a part-time or full-time basis
- Designed for people who already have urban ministry experience, have finished at least a Bachelor's degree, and want to be further developed in the laboratory of actual weekly church ministry leadership
- Residents are given a substantial workload, which will include leading/directing a ministry
- Intentional development of spiritual disciplines
- Immersion in ABC body life, including church membership
- Weekly meeting with a mentor in your field of study and/or the CAUSE director
- Urban Ministry and urban culture site visits and urban leader interviews
- Reading and media assignments from our library of urban ministry materials

Some key features of the Pastoral Internship and/or Pastoral Residency

- 1) Building: Starting a ministry or a building a significant facet of an existing ministry
- 2) Shepherding: Hands on caring for people, including discipling, mentoring and counseling
- 3) Communicating the Bible via teaching and preaching
- 4) Experience in basic pastoral functions like weddings, funerals and visitation
- 5) Functioning in a team context
- 6) Personal spiritual health and discipline
- 7) Accountability

CAUSE Short-Term Experience

Option 1: Weeklong Trip – Explore the Possibilities

Spend a week over a school break or during the summer in Chicago and see what an internship at Armitage is all about. We will provide you with housing as long as your request is made at least 30 days in advance. All you need is transportation and miscellaneous expenses. No formal application is needed – you can just interact with the CAUSE Director to work out the details. During your time here, you can worship with us, visit small groups, observe ministries and explore the city. Exploration trips include briefing and debriefing with the CAUSE Director and/or other ministry leaders.

Option 2: Bring a Team to Armitage

Teams who visit Chicago and stay on the Armitage campus will lodge in one of our buildings. Generally, we house teams in our Hope Center. The Hope building is equipped with several bathrooms, including shower facilities. We also have shower facilities in the Main building. You can prepare meals in our professional kitchen in the Main building, equipped with a refrigerator, freezer, microwave, gas stove, ice machine, coffee maker, and pots and pans. Please provide your own paper and plastic eating supplies and utensils. You will sleep on the floor on a cot mattress that we can provide (in limited quantities), but you will need to bring your own pillows, bed linen or sleeping bag, towels and wash cloths. Feel free to bring your own cots or air mattresses to make your stay more comfortable. Our gym is available for your recreation outside of our regularly scheduled activities, and you are also welcome to join us in many of our scheduled activities (check with a ministry leader if you have questions). All teams working directly with us should plan on attending our Sunday services.

It is important that all groups arrive by 6:00 p.m. We would be glad for you to arrive earlier, even the day before, if you prefer. It is important for you to arrive by 6:00 so that you can get settled and we can give you a tour of the building and provide orientation. The immediate Logan Square neighborhood is among the safer neighborhoods in Chicago, but as with any major urban area, crime is always a possibility. Use common sense in your travels around the city and in the neighborhood in the evening.

Your group leader will be provided a set of keys and given instructions during the campus orientation. The keys open all areas you will need access to during your stay. Security is important, so making sure all doors stay locked and are *never propped open* is *your responsibility*. You will need to turn off any lights, close doors and windows and reset any ministry areas you use prior to that ministry's use of them after you're done (by this we mean to put the area back the way you found it, or to help set it up per facility team instructions). Also, there are a number of ministries that take place during the week throughout our campus. Some of them will be moved or rescheduled to accommodate your stay. Other ministries cannot be rescheduled, such as our Food Pantry and our Sunday Bible studies, so your team will need to make sure all of your luggage and belongings are securely stored out of the way at those times. Ask about observing, attending, or helping out with any of the ministries that take place during your stay.

Other things to note:

- Arrivals must be Monday through Saturday, if possible before 6:00pm, and stay one weekend.
- There should be at least a 1 10 ratio of adult supervisors for youth mission teams.
- Team participants must be in high school or older (minimum age 14).
- If possible, your team should join us for Sunday Bible studies and church services.
- Please provide a mobile number a group leader can always be contacted at, in case of emergencies or other communication needs.
- Our witness in the neighborhood can be positively or negatively impacted by your team long after your departure. In all your ministry endeavors, show the love and integrity of Christ.

CAUSE Summer Intern Program Supplemental Experiences & Assignments

- 1. Weekly meetings with ministry mentor and monthly meetings with CAUSE supervisor.
- 2. Read 2-3 recommended urban ministry books and interact with your supervisor. Complete reading reports.
- 3. Visit 2-3 urban ministry sites from the Site Visit & Interview list (provide site name & date visited).
- 4. Share the gospel at least 2-3 times a week. Keep a record of these and discuss with your mentor/supervisor.
- 5. Interview two Armitage staff members.
- 6. Interview two urban ministry leaders from the Site Visit & Interview list.
- 7. Keep a daily spiritual journal (minimum of five days per week).
- 8. Listen to 4-6 audio messages from the recommended audio resources library.
- 9. View 2-3 urban ministry videos.
- 10. Attend weekly staff meetings, staff prayer and weekly intern debriefings.
- 11. Read and be ready to discuss ministry articles with peers (these are distributed at various times during the summer).
- 12. Teach or Co-Lead three group sessions (provide date, type of group & subject/text).
- 13. Mentor one person for six or more sessions (provide name & dates of sessions).

Armitage CAUSE Residency Program

Purpose

The CAUSE Residency Program is designed to equip and provide opportunities for men and women for vocational ministry by working alongside the ministry staff of the church.

Rationale

Much of the "equipping of the saints" described in Eph. 4:12 takes place in the regular ministries of the church. Beyond that, our NGL and CAUSE Internship programs provide focused mentoring and training. However, there is a need to provide more intense equipping and leadership opportunity for those who believe they have been called by the Lord into full-time ministry.

The CAUSE Residency program provides such people with invaluable on-the-job training in a supportive yet challenging context of church ministry. Building on the formal education a resident has or is receiving, the Residency program provides the following:

- Serving and leadership opportunities to identify and strengthen ministry gifts
- Pastoral supervision and instruction
- Exposure to various leadership meetings, committees, and ministry teams
- Instruction on integrating Scripture into a philosophy and methodology of ministry
- The responsibility of actually leading a weekly ministry
- Ongoing discipleship to enhance personal spiritual development

Thus, an outcome of the program would be men and women who are better prepared to minister in Jesus' name and who will seek to train others as they have been trained (2 Timothy 2:2).

Description

The Residency Program differs from the Internship in several ways. Unlike typical internships, residencies are compensated positions which can last between one and three years. Residents are placed in leadership positions that involve a great deal of responsibility, including opportunities to build teams, create programming, teach and possibly preach, if appropriate.

While a goal of the Residency Program is to provide personalized ministry experience for the residents, the following elements will be included in the majority of residencies:

- Serving 15-40 hours per week at Armitage, depending on the specific program
- For all residents, leading a significant portion of the ministry of Armitage
- Attendance at Staff and Leadership meetings
- Completing reading, writing and experience assignments given by the mentoring pastor
- Ongoing training via ministry appropriate conferences
- Personally discipling and mentoring at least 2 people during the term
- For Pastoral residents, participation with pastoral staff members in the following:
 - Worship Services
 - Counseling
 - Pastoral visits
 - Funerals
 - Weddings

Residency Requirements

Before being considered for the Residency program, a candidate must meet the following requirements:

- Aligned doctrinally and philosophically with the leadership of Armitage
- A member in good standing of Armitage (or in the membership process for those coming from outside ABC)
- A Bachelor's Degree
- An aspiration for full-time ministry following the residency
- A recommendation from a pastor
- A life which reflects both the desire and gifting to serve in a vocational ministry role
- Interview with the Pastoral Team

Responsibilities of the Resident

- Regular participation in the life of our church, including active involvement in our services, Bible Study, Grow Group and any significant events
- Regular attendance at staff meetings
- A transparently positive and God-honoring attitude, including the posture of being a perpetual learner
- Faithful and timely completion of assigned projects
- Maintain a lifestyle which reflects positively on the Lord Jesus and our church

Remuneration

- Residents can be remunerated on a part-time or full-time basis, provided there are adequate funds
- Amounts are negotiable based on any number of factors
